The Office of Transitional Programs at New River Community College (NRCC) Adult Education

General Educational Development (GED) classes are free and offered in the localities of Floyd, Giles, Montgomery, Pulaski and Radford to help adults prepare for the GED test. The classes focus on workforce readiness skills and/or college preparation for career readiness for gaining employment.

Adults who earn a GED demonstrate they have acquired skills equivalent to those of high school graduates. The GED test is a computer-based test, which consists of passing four subtests: Reading, Science, Social Studies and Mathematics. Highly qualified teachers who help adults improve their learning ability; critical thinking and problem solving

skills in order to be successful teach classes. Student orientation is required prior to attending classes.

New Life Recovery Center (Residential Substance Abuse Services)

The residential rehabilitation services at New Life Recovery Center provide treatment for addicted individuals in a residential environment so they can be removed from the situations in which they are most likely to relapse, at a time when they are the most vulnerable. The program provides individual and group therapy for the clients, as well as education about addiction and case management. This includes planning to get them back into an environment that will be more supportive of their decision to stop using alcohol or drugs. New Life Recovery Center is located in Fairlawn. A 30-day program, New Life has ten beds and serves both males and females who are 18 years of age or older with a primary diagnosis of alcohol and/or drug dependence. Residents may also have co-occurring mental health disorders.
