

WHY READING IS IMPORTANT

- 61% of low-income families have no books at all in their homes for their children.
- 37% of children arrive at kindergarten without the skills necessary for lifetime learning and half of children from lowincome communities start first grade up to two years behind their peers.
- Reading aloud to young children is not only one of the best activities to stimulate language and cognitive skills; it also builds motivation, curiosity, and memory.
- Having books in the home is twice as important as the parents' level of education.
- Children who aren't reading at grade level by the end of third grade are four times as likely to drop out of high school. Recent studies share that 78% of juvenile crime is committed by high school dropouts.

Providing books to children in low-income homes can help break the link between poverty and poor academic outcomes.

HOW YOU CAN HELP



Mission

Open Book for the New River Valley is a community book-sharing project that collects and distributes new and gently used books to needy children and youth in our area. Having books of their own in the home is a crucial factor in childhood literacy and is a vital indicator of successful outcomes.

We believe all children deserve an equal chance to love and enjoy books of their own. We have exceeded our goals of donating 10,000 books in Giles, Franklin, Henry, Montgomery, Patrick, Pittsylvania, Pulaski, and Wythe Counties and the cities of Danville, Martinsville, and Radford.



What we do

Open Book regularly provides books to Giles and Pulaski County children in need through these programs which distribute books during home visits:

Open Book has developed a network of community bookcases where children in need are able to access free books including:

- The Narrows Laundromat

In the past, Open Book has given away books at the Giles County Kids' Fishing Day, through the summer free lunch programs in Pearisburg and Narrows, and at the Giles Youth-Adult Partnership's Summer Youthfest.

Additionally, books have been distributed through the Public Library in Narrows, and at the Community Center Library in the Meadowview apartment complex in Pulaski.

Most recently, we have delivered books and backpacks to the Juvenile Detention Homes in Christiansburg and Farmville.
